#### **About Our Speakers & Panelists**

#### Talk Title: The Visible Radiologist - Geraldine McGinty, MD, MBA, FACR

Dr McGinty is currently Senior Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs, Professor of Clinical Radiology and Population Health Sciences, Weill Cornell Medicine. Since 2017, she teaches Healthcare Leadership in the combined Weill Cornell Medicine and Cornell School of Business executive MBA/MS (EMBA/MS) program. More recently her focus has been on the impact of Artificial Intelligence on Medical Imaging and has spoken at the Turing Institute and to the WHO Focus Group on AI in Healthcare on this topic.

Dr McGinty was 2020-2021 President of the American College of Radiology. In 2018, she was Chair of the ACR's Board of Chancellors – the first woman to hold this office. She is an internationally recognized expert in imaging economics, she was Chair of the American College of Radiology's Commission on Economics and the radiology member of the American Medical Association's Relative Value Update Committee from 2012-2016.

Dr. McGinty did her medical training in Ireland at the National University and then came to the USA for residency at the University of Pittsburgh, then women's imaging fellowship in Massachusetts General Hospital and whilst working at Montefiore Medical Center in the Bronx, she completed an MBA at Columbia University. In 2015 she was voted Radiology's Most Effective Educator by the readers of Aunt Minnie, a radiology news site with more than 140,000 members. She has more than 18000 followers on Twitter.

### Talk Title: Engaging Colleagues in Medicine -Chantsalsuren Galbaatar, MD

Dr Galbaatar is a Clinical Radiologist at the Intermed Hospital Mongolia. She may have only completed radiology residency in 2018 in the Mongolian National University of Medical Sciences—however, she is CEO & Co-Founder of the Mongolian Medical Women's Association where she works on empowering projects for women in medicine to develop leadership skills and networking. She also conducts patient education events and hosts regular Women in Medicine podcasts on YouTube in Mongolian.

Dr Galbaatar has been teaching general and medical English to medical professionals since 2016. She has experience as an interpreter with international organizations such as Projects Abroad and Interplast from Australia. In 2021, she initiated and coordinated a Mentorship Program collaboration between the Mongolian Medical Women's Association and Interplast Australia and New Zealand. In 2022, she participated in a Women's Clinical Leadership Networking Discussion.

Dr Galbaatar has experience in clinical data collection and analysis of radiology images and has interest in digital transformation and Artificial Intelligence. As a clinical radiologist, she works closely with clinicians and public health workers and manages continuous education programs, teleradiology and AI Projects. In addition, she finds time to be the managing editor of the Mongolian Journal of Radiology.

## Talk Title: Captivating Communicator - Angelica Smith Robinson, MD

Dr Robinson, an Assoc Prof of Radiology is a passionate breast imaging radiologist and popular public speaker. She did her surgical internship, diagnostic radiology residency, and specialized breast imaging training through the Mayo Clinic, University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center, and the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, respectively.

In her current roles as Director of University of Texas Medical Branch (UTMB) Breast Imaging & Breast Imaging Fellowship and Vice Chair of Clinical Operations, UTMB Dept of Radiology-Dr Robinson contributes to resident and fellow education, ensuring a new generation of breast imaging radiologists prepared for the future of medicine and maintains rigorous professional standards throughout the entire radiology department.

She has served as chair of the Susan G. Komen Houston Medical Advisory Panel, and nationally as Co-Moderator/Director for the National Medical Association 2019, 2020 Breast health symposia. Dr. Robinson is committed to eliminating breast health disparities in underserved and minority communities and created the UTMB CARES program which has provided over 1000 free mammograms for uninsured women in Galveston County, Texas.

She has received various awards including being named as a "Woman Creating Change" award recipient (Change Magazine), "Texas Super Doctors Rising Star" award recipient (Texas Monthly Magazine), and "Top Doc's" award recipient (Houstonia Magazine).

### Guest Panelist: Charles Goh, MBBS, FRCR, MMed

Dr Goh is dual accredited for Diagnostic Radiology and Nuclear Medicine. He is Consultant Radiologist in the Dept of Nuclear Medicine & Molecular Imaging, Singapore General Hospital (SGH) and Deputy Chief Medical Informatics Officer in SGH. He also has an academic appointment as Clinical Assistant Prof in Duke-NUS.

He is actively involved in the training of residents. He is a faculty member for the National Nuclear Medicine Residency Training Program, National Diagnostic Radiology Residency Training Program, the National Family Medicine Residency Training Program and the National Final Master of Medicine(Radiology)/FRCR Preparatory Course. Summarising Dr Goh's education philosophy - '...learners who are actively engaged in the education process learn best. Students should be challenged to push their boundaries with a safety net to fall back on should they stumble..'

He has been involved in the organization of multiple local and regional webinars, workshops and conferences. Dr Goh currently serves on the Administrative Board of the Asian Oceanian School of Radiology, AOSR Education Committee and Honorary Secretary of the Singapore Radiological Society.

Dr Goh has a stellar record during his medical school training in the National University of Singapore and radiology residency training earning medals and awards. He completed diagnostic radiology residency in 2013 and completed further training in nuclear medicine in 2017. More recently he was awarded the Singapore Health Quality Service Award (2021 Hero Award- SingHealth Duke-NUS Academic Medical Centre) and in 2020 & 2022 the SingHealth RiSE Outstanding Faculty Award for SingHealth Residency.
